Where "(E)" precedes the CS number, it indicates an emergency commercial standard, drafted under war conditions with a view toward early revision.

Mimeographed copies of Commercial Standards are available without charge, except those marked "NM" (Not Mimeographed), from the Division of Trade Standards, National Bureau of Standards, Washington 25, D.C. In a few cases, marked "MO", mimeographed copies only (no printed copies) are available.
