GENERAL INFORMATION

Where the price is stated, the publication can be purchased from the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington 25, D. C. A discount of 25 percent will be allowed on orders totalling 100 or more copies. The prices quoted are for delivery to addresses in the United States and its territories and possessions, and in certain foreign countries which extend the franking privilege. In the case of all other countries, one-third the cost of the publication should be added to cover postage.

Remittances should be made either by coupons (obtainable from the Superintendent of Documents in sets of 20 for \$1.00 and good until used), or by check or money order payable to the "Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington 25, D. C.", and sent to him with order.

Many public and college libraries receive copies of all Commercial Standards regularly as issued, and maintain files for reference.

Where "(E)" precedes the CS number, it indicates an emergency commercial standard, drafted under war conditions with a view toward early revision. Those marked "OP" are out of print, but, in general, are mimeographed or may be consulted at technical libraries or many public libraries.

Mimeographed copies of Commercial Standards are available without charge, except those marked "NM" (Not Mimeographed), from the Division of Trade Standards, National Bureau of Standards, Washington 25, D. C. In a few cases, marked "MO" (Mimeographed Only), no printed copies are available, although they may become available before this list is revised.

<u>Under A, Alphabetical List</u>, (beginning Page 2), titles are alphabetized according to the first word of the title, and according to the Federal Standard Stock Catalogue Listing.

<u>Under B, Classified List</u>, (beginning Page 8), titles are grouped for the convenience of those who have expressed a desire for a quick survey of commercial standards in specific fields.

The Division of Trade Standards is currently working on a large number of subjects, and drafts representing various stages of procedure are available. If you are interested in subjects that are not in the list of established Commercial Standards, an inquiry directed to the Division will bring the latest information this Division has.
