







1904-1919:

- (a) BULLETIN OF THE BUREAU OF STANDARDS. A quarterly journal. The Bulletin contained all research papers until, in 1910, it was limited to scientific papers; see (f) for technical papers.
- (b) Reprints¹ from (a). Scientific Papers S1 to S329.
- (c) Volumes² of (a), cloth bound, consecutively paged and indexed. Volumes 1 to 14.

1919-1928:

- (d) SCIENTIFIC PAPERS¹ OF THE BUREAU OF STANDARDS (separates continuing series (b), Nos. S330 to S572).
- (e) Volumes² of (d), cloth bound, consecutively paged and indexed. Volumes 15 to 22.

1910-1928:

- (f) TECHNOLOGIC PAPERS¹ OF THE BUREAU OF STANDARDS, T1 to T370. Prior to T203 issued only as separates.
- (g) Volumes² of (f) cloth bound, beginning with T203, volume designated No. 16, to volume 22; consecutively paged and indexed.

1928:

- (h) BUREAU OF STANDARDS JOURNAL OF RESEARCH (monthly), continuing and consolidating series (d) and (f). Subscription, \$2.50 per year, United States, Canada, Cuba, Mexico, Newfoundland, and Republic of Panama; \$3.25 elsewhere.³
- (i) Volumes³ of (h), cloth bound (six monthly issues), consecutively paged and indexed.
- (j) Separates¹ of (h) issued under new series title, RESEARCH PAPERS OF THE BUREAU OF STANDARDS.

Circular No. 24 contains a list of (a) to (g) and a subject index of same to June 30, 1925. The SUPPLEMENT TO CIRCULAR No. 24 continues this list and index. These give a complete list and index of all publications to December 31, 1931, and the mimeographed insert furnished with the Supplement brings the list practically up to date. Copies of this circular will be found at most Government depository libraries having files of the Bureau's publications. Circular No. 24 may be purchased from the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. for 25 cents; the Supplement for 15 cents. Copies will be furnished to public libraries without charge on request to the Bureau of Standards.
