State Building Regulatory Programs for
Mobile Homes and Manufactured
Buildings--A Summary

Information describing State mobile home and manufactured building regulatory programs are presented in two series of summary tables. The tables provide information on salient elements of the enabling legislation and the administrative rules and regulations promulgated for each State program. Other features of the various enforcement programs, including the status of reciprocity for the interstate acceptance of mobile homes and manufactured buildings are also enumerated.

Key words: Building regulation; enforcement; evaluation; inspection; legislation; manufactured building; mobile homes; rules and regulations; state-of-the-art study.

1. Background

State-of-the-art studies of State mobile home and manufactured building regulatory programs were initiated by the Office of Building Standards and Codes Services (OBSCS) in 1972 as one of the tasks of the Coordinated Evaluation System (CES) Project [1]*. The purposes of this task were: (1) to gather detailed background data for the development of model informational documentation [2], and (2) to provide data for a state-of-the-art report on mobile home and manufactured building regulatory programs.

Based on data collected in the state-of-the-art studies, preliminary summary tables were prepared on State Manufactured Building Programs (October 1973) and on State Mobile Home Programs (January 1974). These tables were subsequently distributed to State Governors, National Conference of State on Building Codes and Standards (NCSBCS) delegates, and other interested parties for comments and suggested revisions. Response to these preliminary tables has provided considerable new data which has been incorporated into this report.

In order to readily accommodate the numerous changes in various aspects of State building regulatory programs, a computer-based system was developed to facilitate the storage and retrieval of such data. The series of tables presented in this report were generated directly from the computer-based information and retrieval system. The system also has the capability of allowing the computer to be interrogated to provide particular output information (or tables) on other aspects of the collected data (e.g., occupancy classifications, codes adopted, etc.).

Because of the rapid changes in the building regulatory field at the State level, the actual status of some items of tabulated data may be changed by the time of publication. Also, States are introducing new legislation continually, and some laws providing for specific regulatory programs may have been enacted which are not reported herein. For this reason, key State officials are identified by name, address, and telephone number in order that latest details on individual States may be obtained directly.

2. Overview

The primary objective of this report is to provide a compilation and summary of pertinent data on various aspects of State mobile home and manufactured building regulatory programs which will be useful to State and local building officials, to Delegates and committee members of the National Conference of States on Building Codes and Standards (NCSBCS), and to various other segments of the building and mobile home industry. It is planned to update

and reissue the tables in the future, as may be required, to reflect changes in State programs as well as to develop additional summary information on other building regulatory systems which exist at the State level, such as statewide preemptive building code programs.




Figure 2 - STATUS OF MANUFACTURED BUILDING REGULATORY PROGRAMS IN THE U.S. AS OF JUNE 1, 1974

The status of mobile home and manufactured building regulatory programs (as of June 1, 1974) are depicted graphically on outline maps in figures 1 and 2. As indicated by the maps, thirty-five states have enabling legislation and regulatory programs for mobile home construction and twenty-five states have such laws for the regulation of manufactured buildings. For several other States, the enabling legislation is awaiting enactment or the regulatory program itself is in various stages of development.

3. Discussion of Summary Tables

The summary data is presented in two series of tables--series 1 pertains to mobile home programs and series 2 covers the regulation of manufactured buildings.

Tables 1.0 and 1.0.1 (mobile homes) and Tables 2.0 and 2.0.1 (manufactured buildings) provide detailed information on important features of the enabling legislation--i.e., dates of enacted laws, applicability of law, occupancies covered, preemption status, advisory committees, appeals procedures, criminal penalties, and other key provisions of the applicable legislation.

Tables 1.1, 1.1.1, and 1.1.2 (mobile homes) and Tables 2.1, 2.1.1, and 2.1.2 (manufactured buildings) provide specific information on the administrative rules and regulations adopted by each State and include information on such provisions as construction codes and standards cited in the law as well as those adopted by rules and regulations, details on the evaluation, approval, inspection and certification processes, and third party accreditation procedures.

Tables 1.2 through 1.2.3 (mobile homes) and Tables 2.2 through 2.2.3 (manufactured buildings) pertain to the administration and enforcement aspects of each program and provide information on the cognizant Department or Agency to contact for further information in each State along with the name, title, address, and phone number of the Agency official responsible for the program. These tables also present data on program budgets and fees, level of staffing, extent of regulatory activity, utilization of CES model documents, and information system utilized.

Table 1.3 (mobile homes) and Table 2.3 (manufactured buildings) provide space for any pertinent qualifying remarks or general notes about a particular state's programs.

In the tabular columns of certain column headings a definite applicability is indicated by an "X" (representing a positive or "yes" response) whereas a definite non-applicability or a specific exclusion is indicated by an "O" (for a negative or "no" response). In those situations where a non-applicability may have indirectly been implied, the entry has been left blank. It is also possible that a blank entry appears because the necessary information to make a distinct determination was not available.




FIGURE 4--Histogram of Type of Agency Involved in Evaluation, Approval, and In-Plant Inspection Functions for Existing Mobile Home and Manufactured Building Regulatory Programs

Certain key factors of the tabulated data have been selected for further summary and comparison. Figure 3 displays selected factors relevant to the overall regulatory process and contained, in varying degrees, among the programs studied. Figure 4 shows the type of institutional agency (or combinations of agencies) involved in various aspects of significant regulatory functional activities.

4. Updating for Future Reports

The tables contained herein summarize the status of mobile home and manufactured building regulatory programs as reported by the State governments of the Nation. Based on feedback information received from the States, it is planned to keep the summary tables and computer-based data bank from which they are generated current, with supplementary information and revisions issued in the future. Accordingly, any corrections, additions, and

IN THE U.S. AS OF JUNE 1, 1974



in Existing Mobile Home and Manufactured Building Regulatory Programs
